## **7th Annual Woodrow Wilson School Public Affairs Forum Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs Princeton University, Robertson Hall, Dodds Auditorium**

***Registration Deadline (& District Approval) by March 12, 2010***

The 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Woodrow Wilson School Public Affairs Forum at Princeton University will be held on Friday, May 14<sup>th</sup>. Schools should plan to begin arriving at the University at 9:00 am so that students are in their seats no later than 9:30. There will be a morning and an afternoon session with the program ending by 2:00. Lunch will be provided by Princeton University. The topics covered in the morning and afternoon sessions will be announced later. Topics covered in the past were:

- The Future of the Mideast Peace Process
- Polarization of American Politics
- U.S. Foreign Policy & National Security
- How the Media Choice Increases Inequality in Political Involvement & Polarizes Elections
- The Future of American Democracy in the Context of the Mid-term Elections

This program targets high school juniors and seniors.

**We will need to know no later than Friday, March 12<sup>th</sup>, whether your district wants to participate (and you have district approval for this field trip).** The only cost to the district will be busing to and from the event (and maybe your foundation can help out with this if there is no money left in the school budget for field trips). You will be able to send 20 people (including both teachers and students) to this event.

The auditorium holds approximately 200 people, so if fewer than 10 schools are interested, you will be able to invite more than 20 people.

PLEASE do not say "yes" if you have not checked this out with both the high school teachers and the district office. We would hate to limit the number of participants to 20 people per district and then find out a week before the event that some schools are not able to attend because appropriate approval was not received.

If you are interested, let us know how many people you expect to send and the name and e-mail address of the district contact person to whom we can begin communicating (hopefully, the teacher who will be the chaperone that day).
